BACKGROUND:

CARI is an Autonomous Apex Public Agricultural Research Institute, the main institution for agricultural research in Liberia evolved from the Central Agricultural Experimental Station (CAES) in the 1980s into a reputable center of excellence in applied and adaptive research in West Africa before Liberia's civil crisis which devastated it. CARI is currently faced with various problems including a lack of human resources and financial resources to implement its research programs. The agriculture research strategic plan is meant to provide a framework for CARI which sets the direction, new organization structure, research priorities, and time frame for research, capacity development, and related activities; all of which are consistent with Liberian government policies and programs including the National Food Security and Nutrition Strategy (FSNS) (2008), The Pro-poor Agenda for prosperity and development (PADP) (2018), and the Liberia Agriculture Sector Investment Program (LASIP II) (2018-2021). In conformity with the key government policies, the Central Agriculture Research Institute's (CARI) research strategy covers seven thematic research programs: 1) Crops Program, 2) Livestock and Fisheries Program 3) Natural Resource Management 4) Agricultural Biotechnology and Laboratory Services Program 5) Mechanization and irrigation 6) Socio-economics

and Applied statistics, and 7) Post-harvest and food processing. The overall objective of the Agricultural Research Strategy for CARI is to contribute to meeting the food needs of the population, ensuring economic and social development, and the eradicating of poverty in Liberia through the development and dissemination of demand-driven agriculture technologies and innovations.

ABOUT THE ROLE:

The Deputy Director-General for Research Programs (DDGRP) shall serve as the principal Deputy to the Director-General (DG), and will lead all programs in close consultation with the DG, heads of programs, and research team. Under the supervision and consultation with the Director General of CARI, the DDGRP will plays key role in the formulation of agricultural research policies and programs in the context of national agricultural policies, poverty alleviation, food security, and improved livelihoods; and supervises and conducts broad-based research on food and cash crops, livestock, fisheries, land and water management, natural resource management, agro-forestry, socioeconomics studies, postharvest activities, bio-safety, and climate change.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES:

Under the supervision of the Director General of CARI, the DDGRP:

- Plays key role in the formulation of agricultural research policies and programs in the context of national agricultural policies, poverty alleviation, food security, and improved livelihoods.
- Supervises and conducts broad-based research on food and cash crops, livestock, fisheries, land and water management, natural resource management, agro-forestry, socioeconomics studies, postharvest activities, bio-safety, and climate change.
- Monitors and evaluates the adoption and impact of agricultural research on productivity.
- Maintains registers of research scientists, projects, and results and produces annual reports
 highlighting the management, scientific, training, and disseminate knowledge on improved
 technologies to stakeholders that strengthen local capacity.
- Sets up a functional innovation platform(s) of diverse public and private stakeholders (farmers, social and academic actors, etc.) to foster interaction among the groups to ensure demand-driven research.
- Prepares and forwards to the Government of Liberia, through the Director General and Governing Board of Directors of CARI, annual work plan and budget, and annual performance of research activities at CARI.
- Represents the DG in regional and international agricultural research forums.
- Ensures the management of a national crop and livestock gene banks; quality assurance of technologies developed, adapted, multiplied and disseminated through the uptake pathways.

- Works with the heads of the various research program units and scientists to develop coordinated comprehensive annual work plan and budget based on prioritized research activities of CARI.
- Enhances public awareness of the importance of scientific research to agricultural and economic development and mobilizes human, financial, and capital resources from the government, donors, the private sector, and within the institute for the benefit of CARI.
- Ensure transparency, accountability and cost-effectiveness in managing CARI effectively, and efficient utilization of all resources entrusted to the various research program units.
- Establishes and manages effective partnerships/linkages with relevant institutions and agencies within and outside the Liberia.
- Promotes the transfer of technology to industry/agricultural business and commercialization of research in general.
